

DWGC Terms and Conditions

Purpose

"The Purpose of the DWGC mailing list is to share general Wargaming and hobby information with the DWGC society/club which is made up of various age, ethnic and gender groups and as such should be used in a spirit that is socially acceptable to all."

Policy

The DWGC and DWGC-WH Mailing lists subscribes and adheres to the terms of service laid out by Google Groups found here

In addition the following will be considered as unacceptable behaviour (but not limited to):

1. Sending of spam emails to the list, where "spam" is defined as:
 - a. Unwarranted chain letters, jokes, etc.
 - b. Unsubstantiated information or trolling
2. Personal insults against another members of the list
3. Content that is sexually explicit or ambiguous in nature
4. Content that is racially derogatory, either explicit or ambiguous in nature
5. Anything else that contravenes the Google Terms of Service but not explicitly mentioned here.

Process

1. The moderators will be decided by the mailing list owner.
2. Moderators will be responsible for checking that content is acceptable
3. The following procedure will be used as a guideline in the event of offenses listed above. Some instances may warrant more severe steps
 - a. Undesired behaviour may result in a public warning on first offence
 - b. A repeated offence may warrant Moderation or the members rights to post to the group may be revoked for a period no longer than 3 months
 - c. The offender will be publicly informed that they are on moderation
 - d. Further repeated offences may result in banning for a period no less than 6 months
 - e. The offender will be publically informed that they are being banned
4. In all circumstances Moderators must agree on a majority, what warrants an offense and what action to take

Objections and Appeals

1. Any member can lodge an objection to another member's post by contacting a moderator privately
2. Moderators must then adhere to the guidelines above
3. Feedback must be given to the complainant

4. Any member that is placed under moderation may lodge an appeal to the moderation team after at least 1 week or alternatively to any one of the club chairmen.
5. If lodged with a club chairman, he/she must then take up the issue with the moderation team and seek a resolution that is agreeable to all.
